FACTS & FIGURES

... **DATE:** From June 10 to 23, 2024, the Serbian capital Belgrade will stage the 37th edition of the European Aquatics Championships in Swimming (17-23 June) and Diving (17-23 June), as well as Artistic Swimming (10-14 June) and Open Water Swimming (12-15 June) in the first competition week. High Diving – introduced to the European schedule in Rome 2022 – is not part of the 2024 Belgrade Championships.

... **EUROPEAN AQUATICS (EA / LEN):** The “Ligue Européenne de Natation” – since 2023 European Aquatics – was founded on August 30, 1927 in Bologna/ITA by 11 countries and their national swimming federations, one year after the first European Championships in Swimming, Diving and Water Polo had been held in Budapest. Today European Aquatics has 52 member federations from Albania to Ukraine.

... **HISTORY of EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Staged for the first time in 1926, the championships have been constantly evolving in the past 98 years. While the inaugural edition in Budapest featured men-only events – six in swimming, two in diving and the water polo tournament –, the upcoming edition in Belgrade will have 74 medal events and competition will be staged in four disciplines: swimming, diving, artistic swimming and open water swimming.

During the almost century-long history, the championships’ programme has been expanded. Female athletes were welcomed right from the second edition in 1927, in swimming and in diving. Synchronised swimming, after a trial-like stand-alone event in Amsterdam 1974, became a ‘full-time’ feature at the ‘big’ championships from Jonkoping 1977. Eight years later Oslo hosted the first women’s water polo championships, then from 1987 the ladies’ teams could also share the grand stage at the major event. Open water had three stand-alone meets before the discipline debuted at the championships in Vienna 1995, though from time to time it was separated from the LEN family gathering, when the championships were held in the spring in Olympic years in cities where the weather did not favour the warriors of the wild waters. However, summer editions always include the aquatic marathonists.

With the championships growing bigger and bigger, LEN decided to stage the European Water Polo Championships as a stand-alone event – which proved to be the right step: since the continents’ teams are the rulers of this sport, the WP championships have been outstanding success since 1999, while the European Aquatics Championships remained a sustainable event from the organisers’ point as well as a highlight of the international sport calendar. ...

... In recent years, alongside with World Aquatics, European Aquatics has also launched more and more mixed events in all disciplines: mixed relays have become a big boost for the programme (the mixed 4x200m free is only contested at the Europeans), just as the mixed synchro events in diving, the mixed duet in artistic swimming and the mixed relay in open water. And to honour gender equality, the 2022 Rome edition featured the first-ever men solo event in artistic swimming.

The European top showcase visits Belgrade for the first time. In 2006 and 2016, the Serbian Capital was host to the European Water Polo Championships for Men and Women - in 2016 with the “record spectators crowd” of 18.500 people following the Men’s final between Serbia and Montenegro (10-8) on January 23. Belgrade also hosted the first ever World Aquatics Championships, held in the Tašmajdan Sports and Recreation Center from 31 August to 9 September 1973. Belgrade also hosted several Water Polo Champions League Finals (2013, 2021, 2022, 2023). In two years time, the water polo Europeans will return to Belgrade.



The record holder still is Hungary, where EA's top showcase was staged 6 times (1926, 1958, 2006, 2010, 2021 in Budapest, 2012 in Debrecen – water polo Europeans were also held in Budapest in 2001, 2014 and 2020). In this ranking, Vienna sits in the second place with three championships (1950, 1974, 1995), while Rome (1983, 2022) joined London (1938, 2016) and Berlin (2002, 2014) as two-time organiser (though Italy staged more editions: Bologna 1927 and Turin 1954).

... **HOSTS:** The Serbian Swimming Federation (Plivacki savez Srbije) – founded in 1904 – is the governing body of swimming in Serbia. It carries out its activities directly and through three regional associations: Swimming Federation of Vojvodina, Swimming Federation of Belgrade and Swimming Federation of Central Serbia. Belgrade will host the European Aquatics Championships for the first time.

... **PARTICIPANTS:** According to the final entries, as of today, **22 LEN / EA Member Federations** will compete in **Artistic Swimming**. **21 EA Member Federations** will be represented in the Open Water Swimming events. The numbers of Federations and athletes participating in the **Diving and Swimming** competitions will be announced after the respective deadlines.

... **TITLES:** A total of **74 titles** will be awarded: **43 in Swimming** (Berlin 2014 saw the “official première” of the two mixed relay events 4x100m free and 4x100m medley; Glasgow 2018 saw the “official première” of the mixed relay event 4x200m free), **13 in Diving**, **11 in Artistic Swimming** and **7 in Open Water Swimming**.

- For the sixth time in Diving, medals will be awarded in the **Mixed 3m Synchro** and **Mixed 10m Synchro** events.
- In Artistic Swimming, the **Mixed Duet** will be on the programme for the fifth time.
- For the second time after 2022, medals will be awarded in the Artistic swimming men's solo events.

... **COMPETITION MODUS:** In **Swimming**, ten lanes will be used for the heats. All semi-finals (50m, 100m and 200m) and finals will be carried out in eight lanes. In individual events, a maximum of four entries per Federation and per event may be submitted. Notwithstanding times and places achieved in the heats, only the two fastest swimmers of each Federation may proceed to the semi-finals or finals. The qualifiers for the final shall be 1st and 2nd in each semi-final together with the fastest times from the remaining swimmers in the semi-finals.

In individual **Diving** events two entries per Federation and per event may be submitted. For the Synchronised Events and the Team Event, only one team per Federation and per event may be entered.

In **Artistic Swimming** one entry per Federation and per event may be submitted. In **Open Water Swimming** three entries per Federation and per event may be submitted.

... **MEDALS:** In the history of the Championships – from 1926 in Budapest until today – a total number of **4.749 medals** in gold, silver and bronze have been awarded in Swimming (long course 3.091), Diving (987), Synchronised/Artistic Swimming (342, since Amsterdam 1974) and Open Water Swimming (329, since Stari Grad 1989).

Additionally, the first 6 High Diving medals were awarded in Rome 2022. And 162 medals (incl. the 6 medals in the Men's and Women' Water Polo events of Zagreb + Dubrovnik/Men's tournament and Eindhoven/Women's tournament 2024) were awarded in Water Polo for men (since 1926) and women (since 1985).



... **PRIZE MONEY:** Almost half million Euros will be awarded to the Athletes and Teams ranked from first (1st) to third (3rd) place across all disciplines.

PREVIEW – ARTISTIC SWIMMING

Artistic Swimming still on the move – Italy, Great Britain and Austria in the medal hunt – 22 Federations to participate – Men’s solo events for the second time

Belgrade (EA) At the European Championships in Glasgow 2018 four federations shared the medals in nine competitions, two – Russia (8) and Ukraine (1) – swept all the golds. At the last two editions, 2022 in Rome and 2023 in Oswiecim, when the European Artistic Championships were part of the European Games in Poland and only eight disciplines were carried out, altogether 13 different nations won at least one medal. This is an indication that the landscape of Artistic Swimming – also thanks to the new events and the brand-new scoring system – is changing more and more.

In Belgrade, a total of 22 European Aquatics Member Federations will participate in the 11 events to be staged in the “Milan Gale Mukatirovic” Sports Centre which was constructed half a century ago for the needs of the first-ever World Aquatics Championships in Belgrade in 1973. Today three outdoor pools and one indoor Olympic pool as well as lots of additional facilities will suit the needs of athletes, teams and spectators.

In the Serbian capital, a total of 11 titles will be at stake. Since 2016, three titles were added in the Technical Routines (Solo, Duet and Team), additionally, since the Europeans in London, the Mixed Duet has become a constant feature of the programme. Budapest 2021 celebrated the debut of the Highlight competition, which from this year on will be run under the name “Acrobatic Routine”. The Combination is not a part of this year’s edition. Rome 2022 witnessed the première of the Men’s solo events (Free and Routine). All contests in Belgrade will be concluded with a spectacular and highly attractive Gala on June 14.

Italy, Greece and Austria will battle for the medals – “New kids on the block”

In Rome 2022, Ukraine topped the medal table celebrating eight victories. 2023 in Oswiecim, Spain finished in top position with 3 gold. As Russia and Ukraine, the dominating nations in the past years, are not competing in Belgrade, and Spain and France opted to skip the women’s and team events, the other powerhouses like Italy (who won 12 out of 36 possible medals in Rome 2022), Greece and Austria will battle for the top position in the medal ranking this time.

For sure, they will be accompanied by other nations who want to take advantage of this unique opportunity. Great Britain and Germany for instance will compete with highly talented young athletes like the 2-time European Junior Champion in Solo 2023, Klara Bleyer, or the British youngsters Ranjuo Tomblin and Robyn Swatman.

Especially the men’s competition will be outstanding. Athletes from seven nations have entered, the youngest is David Martinez from Sweden (17), the oldest is the 36-year-old Renaud Barral for Belgium. Giorgio Minisini (28), the first ever male European Champion in the Men’s solo event, will face a big challenge from the 2023 World Champion from Fukuoka, Dennis Gonzalez (Spain). But Ranjuo Tomblin from Great Britain, who won bronze at his European debut 2023 in Poland with Partner Beatrice Crass in the Mixed duet, and 2022 European bronze medallist Quentin Rakotomalala (France) would like to have a say in the medal awarding.

A proof of the growing popularity of “male artistic swimming” is the fact that for instance Germany will bring two male swimmers to Belgrade – besides Frithjof Seidel, who 2023 won a historical European silver medal as the first man being part of the Free routine combination team in

Oswiecim), youngster Robin Wiehn (17) will celebrate his senior debut in the Mixed Duets.

Local heroes from Serbia want to play important role – Starts in Women’s Solo, Mixed Duet, Team

Serbia’s local heroes want to play an important role on home soil, too. Especially Ivan Martinovic, who claimed the first Serbian medal ever in Artistic Swimming, a bronze in the first-ever men’s solo event in Rome. Together with his partner – in sport as well as in life – Jelena Kontić, Martinovic will compete in both Mixed Duets this time and make Artistic Swimming more popular in Serbia.

Additionally, the hosts – with Kontic and Martinovic – will participate with a new formed team in the team technical. And 17-year-old Teodora Sperlich will also compete in the Women’s Solo Free.

Especially the Mixed Duet, which celebrated its première at the 2015 Worlds in Kazan, has quickly become an attractive addition to the programme at European Championships. In Belgrade, seven teams in the technical event and eight teams in the free event will contest the medals – with Spain’s duo (Dennis Gonzalez and Emma Garcia or Mireia Hernandez) as the top favourites.

Austria’s Alexandri triplets continue winning streak of Worisch, Edinger and Brandl

Austria’s first successes date back to 1985, when Alexandra Worisch not only won Duet gold (together with Eva-Maria Edinger) at the 1985 European Championships in Sofia/BUL, but also had Solo silvers from 1981 (Split) and 1987 (Strasbourg). Worisch’s niece Nadine Brandl, now living in the US, was a top ten synchro swimmer during the first decade of 2000, too.

Nowadays the triplets Anna-Maria, Eirini and Vasiliki Alexandri successfully stepped into the footpaths of their predecessors. In both Solo events, Vasiliki won two bronze medals in Rome and added two more silver at the 2023 Worlds in Fukuoka.

Anna-Maria and Eirini added four duet golds in Fukuoka and Oswiecim to their already impressive medal tally. They are considered the medal favourites at the Olympics in Paris, too. Though, as the duo will only compete in the technical duet in Belgrade, the duets from Great Britain, Netherlands and Israel may set their eyes on medals in the free duet.

The Dutch girls Bregje and Noortje Brouwer, who won a World silver last February in Doha, or Great Britain’s Kate Shortman and Isabelle Thorpe, who not only clinched bronze in Doha, but also won the first ever World Cup at the inauguration of the Olympic Pool in Paris at the beginning of May.

Team events offer opportunity to step on the podium in Belgrade

The team events offer a good opportunity for some nations to step onto the podium for the first time – especially at this 2024 European edition. Ukraine will not compete, Spain will only swim in the Team technical event. This opens the door to Italy, Greece, Great Britain and Germany (in the Acrobatic Routine) to fill the spots on the podium.

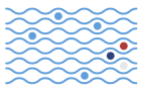

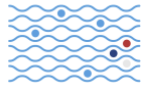

PREVIEW OPEN WATER SWIMMING

Belgrade with seven Open Water competitions in “calm waters” – 10km races with several Olympic medal favourites – 20 Federations to participate at “Ada Ciganlija”

Belgrade (EA) – With a bunch of top swimmers dominating the open water scene in recent years, the 2024 edition of the European Open Water Swimming Championships promises no less than top level competitions.

Unlike in 2022, when the 25km races in the open sea in Ostia had to be halted due to stormy conditions and all other races also had to struggle with the tough conditions, the competitions in Belgrade will take place in “calm waters”. Altogether 20 European Aquatics member federations entered the seven events at “Ada Ciganlija”, a popular recreational area situated in the Sava river, near Belgrade.

A view back to the Rome 2022 results as well as a glimpse at the all-time medal table show that Italy must once again be expected the top favourite in Belgrade – at the men’s as well as at the women’s competitions. With 11 medals (4 of them gold) in 2022 and altogether 86 medals since the inauguration of the Championships in 1989, there is no doubt of Italy’s favourite role.

However, in the absence of Russia (40 medals altogether) and the Netherlands (29), the European powerhouses Germany (60), France (34) and Hungary (17) will try to improve their medal tallies in open water swimming.

Men’s events: Rasovszky, Paltrinieri, Acerenza, Pardoe, Olivier guarantee “Olympic class”

Among those athletes, who are battling for the titles since years, more or less only Germany’s Olympic Champion Florian Wellbrock and Oliver Klemet are missing. Anyway, the field in the Olympic 10km distance looks impressive: both current World and European Champions, Kristof Rasovszky from Hungary, who won his first 10km world title in Doha this year, and Italian Domenico Acerenza, will face a tough challenge.

Multiple World and European Champion Gregorio “King Greg” Paltrinieri, as well as Great Britain’s 2024 World bronze medallist Hector Pardoe and Marc-Antoine Olivier from France will guarantee a top-class event. About 50 days ahead of the Olympic 10km races in the river Seine in Paris, France (August 8/Women and August 9/Men), all of them will use the competition in Belgrade as a last important test.

Hungary’s multiple junior world champion David Betlehem and even Austrian Jan Hercog, who trains and lives in Halle/Saale, Germany, should also be aiming for a place on the podium too after showing high-level performances over the last years.

Frenchmen Axel Reymond leads a small but high-level field in the 25km race. The 2017 and 2019 World Champion will once again meet Italian Dario Verani, who denied Reymond’s historical World triple in 2022, winning the race over the last metres by a margin of only 1,2 seconds. Mario Sanzullo, the later announced winner of the 2022 race in Rome, and Matteo Furlan, the 25km silver medallist at the Europeans in Budapest 2021, complete the Italian trio.

Title defender Beck, Boy, Gabrielleschi and Jousse top medal contenders in the women's events

The women's events boast a wide selection of world-class athletes too. Leonie Beck, the 2023 double World champion in the 5km and 10km event, will be No 1. pick for gold in both events. The German, who lives and trains in Ostia, Italy since years, will try to defend her title from Rome 2022.

Dutch Olympic medallist Sharon van Rouwendaal, who won the European 5km title in 2022, will skip the Belgrade races. Anyway, the current 10km European Champion Beck will be hunted by a group of strong competitors – for example Hungary's junior world and European champion Bettina Fabian, Italy's Rachele Bruni (3-time European Champion 5km 2008, 2011, 2012) and Giulia Gabrielleschi (3rd 5km at the 2022 Europeans) as well as Oceane Cassignol (3rd 5km at the 2021 Europeans) from France and Spaniard Angela Martinez (winner of the EA Open Water Swimming Leg 1 in Piombino).

Beck's compatriot Lea Boy (European 25km title holder 2021), as well as France's Caroline Jousse, who was announced winner of the 25km race in 2022 ahead of Italians Barbara Pozzobon and Veronica Santoni also count among the top contenders for the medals in the women's events.

Youngster Louna Kasvio, 18-year-old daughter of 1992 Olympic bronze medallist Antti Kasvio (200m freestyle), celebrated her international premiere at the European Short Course Championships in Otopeni last December and will now dare the jump into the Open Water. The event will also see a farewell, Anna Olsz from Hungary, silver medallist in 10km, is set to complete her last European race in Belgrade.

Team event: Hungary and France on the heels of title defender Italy

The team event – introduced to the European programme in 2008 – always offers a great opportunity to show team spirit. The Dutch won the 2018 European edition in Glasgow ahead of Germany and France. Italy snatched European gold six times – the last two in Budapest 2021 and on home soil in 2022. Germany took the World title in 2022.

Hungary and France, who both won several medals in this competition so far, but never the European team title, arrive with great ambitions. There is not a shadow of a doubt that this event might be an exciting and emotional conclusion of the Open Water Competitions on August 15.

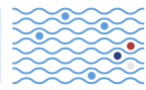
